Marketing Scotland's Best Pudding

Kristin appeared on the first round of Scottish rounds before getting chosen to cook in the Scottish finals. The dish that got Kristin this far in the competition was a trio of Scottish profiteroles, one filled with crannachan, one with tablet and one with orange Athol brose. Kristin has been making profiteroles since she was thirteen however she thought that they needed updating for the competition. After a brainstorming session with a friend the idea of the trio of Scottish profiteroles was born.
